Dates for your diary!

Friday 9th July – End-of-year reports will be sent home via ParentMail

Tuesday 13th July – C4 'end of year' outdoor activity day to celebrate Y6 pupils' time at school. This will be at Little Sutton Scout hut on Heath Lane and led by Rob Smith.

All of the above events are dependent on the guidance and advice in place at the time. More details for each activity will be sent home as and when it becomes available.

Testing for Covid-19 - please read carefully and thoroughly

It is important that if your child becomes unwell with any of the COVID-19 symptoms listed below that you get tested. Testing sites are available across Cheshire and Merseyside, with appointments for tests released daily throughout the day and a new centre has opened locally in Ellesmere Port.

You should book a test if you are displaying any of the COVID-19 symptoms. These include:

- a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

There is no need for members of a pupil's household to have a test, unless they are also symptomatic but **ALL** members of the household do need to isolate until the test results are back.

If your child tests positive they should self-isolate and stay off school for 10 days, the rest of the household need to isolate for at least 10 days. If the test comes back negative they can return to school if they no longer have symptoms and have been fever free for 48hrs.

Summer Reading Challenge

Cheshire West and Chester Libraries are delighted to announce that the Summer Reading Challenge theme this year will be "Wild World Heroes". The theme is about how children can help the environment in their local communities and beyond. The Challenge was entirely online last year but, normally, around 5 000 children come into libraries to do get their books over the Summer Holidays and Libraries would love to see them all again.

The Challenge starts on Saturday 10th July and continues until early September. All children can take part as long as they are library members: joining is free (as long as a parent or guardian gives permission) and no identification is needed.

Wild World Heroes is entirely free and is aimed squarely at children in Key Stages 1 and 2, encouraging them to keep up their reading over the Summer months. New for this year, there will also be a Mini Challenge for pre-schoolers so no-one misses out. Almost all libraries will have one or more free events over the Summer that your children can come to, including animal handling. Depending on guidelines, events may be held outside if necessary and there will also be online events, including the fabulous Mama G and superb John Kirk.

There will also be competitions to win one of 20 Bewilderwood bundles (including books and tickets) and a collection of the "Boy Who Grew Dragons" books by Andy Shepherd.

Each child is given a presentation pack when joining. After their first return visit and reading two books (any book is fine), they are given a sticker sheet, including scratch "n" sniff ones. These stickers can be added to the a big-folder out picture in the pack to show what can be done to help the environment. After reading another two books, they are given another sticker sheet. Finally, after reading a final two books, they will be given a final sticker sheet.

They are then invited to a special awards ceremony in September where they will be awarded with a certificate and a medal. Other ways of handing out the medals and certificates will be used if this is not possible.

The national site is available now and the Cheshire West site will be available from 10 July.
