Class 4 activity day

Please ensure that you complete the ParentMail form ASAP to give your consent for your Year 5/6 child to attend the activity day on 19th July, so that we can make preparations and complete our risk assessment.

School Dinners & Snacks

As we approach the end of the academic year, please can I remind you that school dinners and snacks should be paid for **in advance**. There are a number of children with quite significant outstanding balances on their accounts; I would be grateful if you could clear any debts as soon as possible, especially if your child is in Year 6. A school dinner costs £3.05 if your child is not in receipt of income-based free school meals. A slice of toast/half a bagel is 35p and a bacon butty (Fridays only) is £1.

Class 1 Farm Visit - Thursday 4th July

Class 1 will be visiting the farm on Thursday morning. Your child will need to come to school in their PE kit, ensuring that he/ she wears <u>dark jogging bottoms (not shorts)</u>, due to the hay and long grass. Your child should wear a pair of trainers to school and bring a pair of wellies (preferable) or old trainers for the morning trip in a separate named bag. Your child will also need their school cardigan/jumper and a coat. An extra/spare pair of socks would be a good idea to help keep feet warm! If your child needs insect spray, please administer this at home prior to school. Please do not send any insect spray into school as it will be a distraction and the children should not be carrying medication with them in their coats or bags. If your child suffers from hayfever, it would be helpful if you could give a dose of antihistamine in the morning before school and email school at <u>contact@capenhurstcep.cheshire.sch.uk</u> to let us know that you have done so.

AmaSing - Monday 8th July

Those children taking part in AmaSing on Monday can come to school wearing dark jeans/trousers (no holes please) or black leggings and a **plain red T-shirt**. If your child has ordered an AmaSing T-shirt, they will be handed out to us when we arrive at the Cathedral. In this case, your child should wear their PE T-shirt to school. Please ensure that your child brings a **lightweight coat**.

Please remember to provide your child with enough food and drink to keep them going during the day. Your child may wish to order a hot school dinner on Monday. If not they will need to bring a <u>packed lunch</u>, as well as an afternoon snack, a packed <u>tea and an evening snack</u>. They will need enough <u>drinks</u> as well; we suggest a minimum of three non-fizzy drinks (no glass bottles). The children will not need to bring any money with them; however, they may bring a book or a small colouring pad and pencils. Please ensure that your child brings their food, drinks and a book in a disposable carrier bag or <u>drawstring or pump bag</u>.

If you have purchased audience tickets, doors open at 6.20pm. The concert itself starts at 6.50pm and finishes at about 8.15pm. Children <u>cannot</u> be collected from the Cathedral. We expect to be back at school between 8.45pm and 9pm. Please let the school office know of any changes in your emergency contact details. All children must return to school on the coach even if family members have attended the concert.

Selfless Shelves supporting the West Cheshire Foodbank - All in, bring a tin!

We think that Capenhurst is a welcoming community that includes everyone irrespective of race, gender or religion. The 'Selfless Shelves' is a project where children can earn a token as a reward for a good deed in school. This token can then be exchanged for a food item from the 'Selfless Shelves' which can then be placed in the Foodbank. Everyone is encouraged to bring items for the shelves - the children see this as a 'Circle of Kindness'. We encourage families to help out over the next few days by bringing in things for the Selfless Shelves. All in, bring a tin!



The Foodbank will then use these items to support local families struggling to provide food for themselves. We will continue to support the West Cheshire Foodbank in our traditional way and food items can be brought in and placed on the 'Selfless Shelves' or directly into the collection box. The Foodbank is particularly in need of **UHT Juice, instant mash, custard/rice pudding, tinned meats/meat meals, tinned vegetarian meals, pasta n sauce/pot noodles.**
